

W. Barry Thompson 1951 - 2014

On Friday April 11, 2014, following a brief illness, Barry Thompson passed away, surrounded by his at the Prince County family. Hospital in Summerside. He was 63 years of age. This is such a great loss to Barry's family, his friends, his community and to the Island fiddling community. An avid fiddler and guitarist, Barry made a significant contribution to Island fiddling. A contributor to The Island Fiddler newsletter since 2005, Barry will be greatly missed. Fellow

group member and long time friend, Robert Gallant wrote: "Barry joined the Prince County Fiddlers in 2004 and at the annual meeting that year he agreed to take on the role as President. He was a very dedicated leader whose commitment and generosity benefited all who came in contact with him. He was

especially keen on helping and encouraging the younger players, and at the same time held great respect and admiration for our senior players. He never turned down a request to play and was very good at convincing his sometimes reluctant fellow fiddlers to do the same. Barry travelled extensively on behalf of the Prince County Fiddlers, picking up and delivering newsletters, helping members get to practice and play dates, meetings and other functions, and always on his own time and dime. No one loved the music more than Barry and his attitude and dedication were an inspiration to us all. He persevered in his role as our leader for 10 years, often to physical pain, but unrelenting in his determination to get

the job done. Barry's influence on our lives and our music will keep him in our hearts for many years to come. Gone but never forgotten."

One of the young players that Barry helped and encouraged, Nathan Condon, is now the President of the PEI Fiddlers Society. Nathan wrote: "Most of you know I am not good with words. Whether it be in person or on stage. Today I lost a dear friend, musician and father figure. He taught me many lessons without me knowing it. We shared many stages together. Had many laughs about

many things. He kept me on the straight and narrow. I made mistakes just like anyone. He taught me and showed me not to make those mistakes again. I am going to miss him dearly. There is always a spot in my heart for him. My deepest sympathies to his family as they go through this hard time."
